New York, Dec. 15...The first joint Jewish-Catholic-Protestant direct chartered mercy airlift for the starving children of Biafra left Kennedy International airport today carrying 40 tons of food and medicine, including 100,000 doses of urgently needed measle vaccine donated by UNICEF.

The tri-faith support for the mercy flight comes from Catholic Relief Services, Protestant Church World Service and the American Jewish Emergency Effort for Biafran Relief, which is composed of 21 major national Jewish organizations.

The flight is scheduled to arrive at the Portugese West Africa island of Sao Tome tomorrow, Dec. 16, from where the supplies will be flown into Biafra on the nighttime air shuttles operated by Joint Church Aid, a composite group of Catholic and Protestant relief agencies of the United States and Europe.

Catholic Relief Services contributed toward the flight \$120,000 worth of high protein and concentrated carbohydrate foods and various medicinals; Church World Service contributed \$59,000-worth of food, antibiotics and seeds; and the American Jewish Emergency Effort for Biafran Relief paid the cost of the charter flight, \$40,000. The 100,000 doses of measle vaccine from UNICEF is valued at \$50,000.

The American Jewish Emergency Effort for Biafran Relief has also previously contributed \$38,000 to the Biafra emergency programs of Catholic Relief Services and Church World Service and has sponsored a series of full-page ads in newspapers throughout the country.

Representatives of the three religious groups stated that an interfaith service will be held in New York City in the near future to commemorate the occasion of this tri-faith mercy airlift as well as a memorial to the four crew members who were killed on the night of Dec. 7 flying relief supplies from Sao Tome into Biafra when their aircraft crashed making its approach to the Uli airstrip.
